Spring/Summer Guest (Non-Degree) Student Requirements

A Guest (Non-Degree) Student:

- is required to pay tuition to the University of Michigan according to the tuition & fees schedule. For current tuition and fees, please visit ro.umich.edu/tuition-residency/tuition-fees.
 - is subject to all the admission and registration regulations of the University of Michigan.
 - does not have permission to register as a degree candidate at the University of Michigan.
 - is responsible for determining that the home institution will accept credit earned as a guest student.
 - must understand that falsification of any part of a Guest (Non-Degree) Application may result in cancellation of admission and/or registration.
 - must arrange to have a transcript of any credit earned sent from the University of Michigan to the home institution.

Completing the Application

- All applicants must complete Part I of the application.
 - Applicants who are currently enrolled in college must have Part II completed by the Registrar (or the office at your school that processes guest applications). No applications will be accepted without the official college seal.
 - Applicants who have graduated from college must do one of the following: provide an official copy of your final transcript showing that you have received a degree, or have Part II of the application completed by the college from which you graduated, certifying that you have received a degree.
 - Applicants who were previously enrolled in college, but have not completed an undergraduate bachelor's degree must provide the most current official copy of your transcript or have Part II of the Guest Application certified by the most recently attended institution.
 - Applicants who are graduating high school seniors are NOT eligible for spring guest (Non-Degree) status. Students who will **not** be enrolling at UM-Ann Arbor may apply for summer guest (Non-Degree) consideration. However, applicants who have been admitted and are planning to enroll at the University of Michigan for the fall 2021 term should contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions to determine if changing your term of enrollment is possible.
 - Applicants who are graduating high school seniors must provide a final, official transcript with graduation date and senior grades.
 - Applicants who are F-1 or J-1 visa holders must submit an official transcript in addition to Part II of the Guest Application. In addition, a completed Financial Resources Statement (available online at admissions.umich.edu/frs) and supporting documentation are required. Students already in the U.S. on F-1 or J-1 status must also submit a photocopy of the current I-20 or DS-2019 and I-94 card.
 - Students who are non-native speakers of English are required to provide proof of English language proficiency by taking the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL; ets.org/toefl), the International English Language Testing System test (IELTS; ielts.org), or the Michigan English Test (MET; michiganassessment.org/michigan-tests/met). Scores should be submitted directly from the testing agency to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Please include a photocopy of your score report or the date which you plan to take the TOEFL, IELTS, or MET.

Completed Applications

Completed applications should be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, University of Michigan, 1220 Student Activities Building, 515 East Jefferson Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48109-1316. Fax: 734-936-0740 or scan and email as a PDF attachment to ecredentials@umich.edu. The institution completing Part II may return the completed application directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions under separate cover.

Applications should be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions **at least 14 business days in advance of the first day of classes**. Applications submitted after this time period are not guaranteed to be reviewed prior to the beginning of the semester. This office will determine admissibility as applications are received and will notify the applicant of a decision by email. Students are typically notified of their decision two to four weeks after receipt of the application. Please be aware that incomplete applications will delay the review process.

At a later time, if you change from Non-Degree to degree-seeking status and are admitted and enroll as a transfer student, all courses you completed as a Guest (Non-Degree) student will be added to your transfer credits and grades on your U-M academic record.

- You have attended or graduated from an out-of-state high school and have been involved in educational pursuits for the majority of time since high school graduation.
- You previously attended any U-M campus (Ann Arbor, Dearborn, or Flint) as a nonresident.

Other circumstances may also require you to file an application for in-state tuition. For questions or assistance, contact the Residency Classification Office at 734-764-1400. The deadline dates for submitting an application apply to the term for which residency is sought and are as follows: July 31 for spring, spring/summer and summer terms. Processing times can be lengthy. It is recommended that applications be submitted as soon as possible.

The information requested in item 19 below is optional and will not be used for admissions purposes. It will be used to satisfy federal reporting requirements and may be used for other purposes allowed by law.
