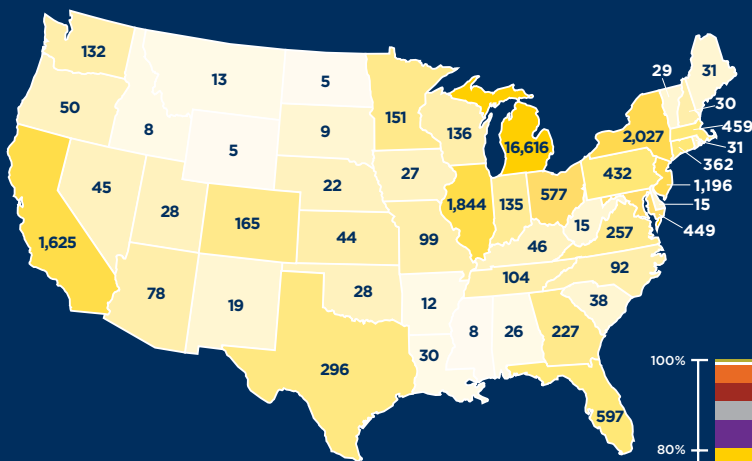

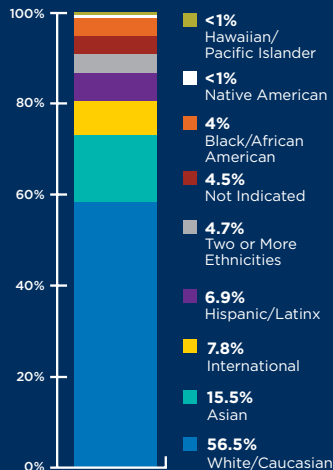

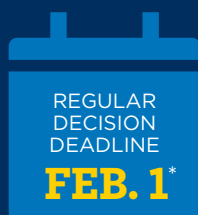
The University of Michigan is looking for students who are curious about new ideas, new people, and new experiences. Excellent grades and top test scores are important, too.

All students must follow the same basic steps to apply to U-M. First, you must fill out and submit the Common Application at commonapp.org or the Coalition Application at coalitionforcollegeaccess.org, as well as the University of Michigan Questions. Only one application is needed and no preference is given to either application.

The first-year application deadline is February 1*, but consideration for admissions depends on the space available in the individual school or college to which you apply. You should submit your application as early as possible.

We recommend applying by the November 15 Early Action deadline to receive the most competitive merit scholarship consideration.

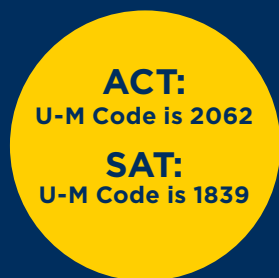

SAT OR ACT

Students will be considered regardless of their ability to test or provide test scores, and may choose to not submit scores or to submit other examples of their academic progress at their discretion. If, by the deadline, a student is unable to sit for and submit an SAT I or ACT test score, they may choose to submit any standardized testing result (PSAT, Pre-ACT, AP's, etc.).



TOEFL, IELTS, OR MET

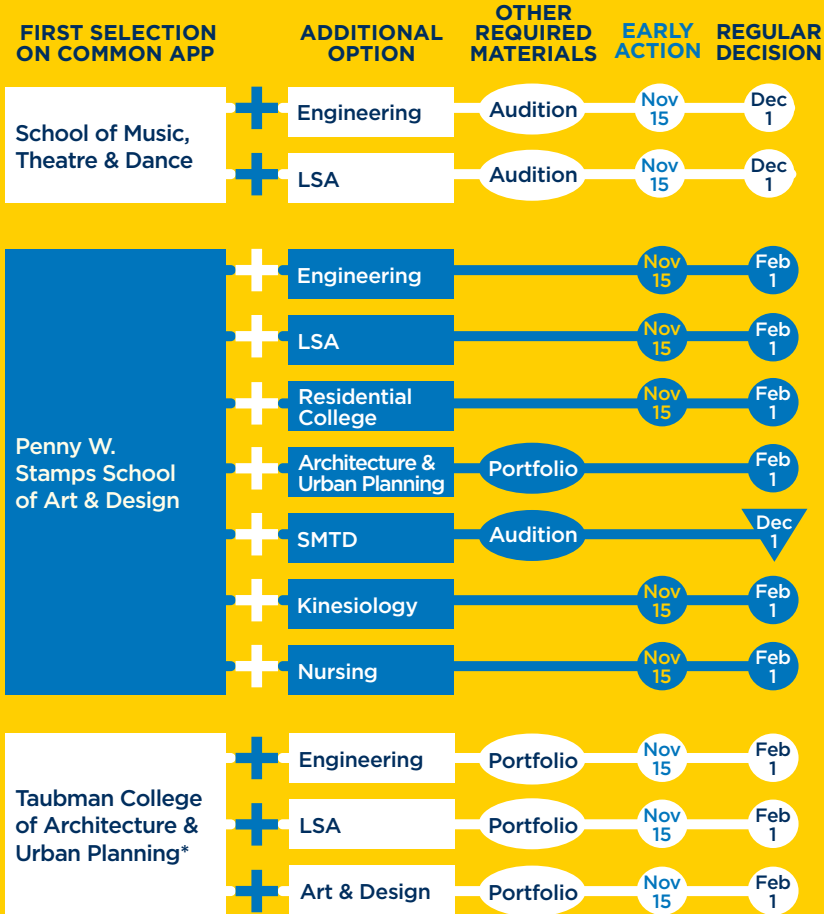
International students who may not be able to test are encouraged to submit any predictive and/or external examination or national examination, state, provincial, national, and international exams or predicted results.

OCTOBER 1 – MARCH 1:

As soon as possible, submit the College Scholarship Service (CSS) Financial Aid Profile form online at cssprofile.collegeboard.org to be considered for all need-based university grants and scholarships.



OCTOBER 1:

As soon as possible, submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.ed.gov to be considered for all federal grants, loans, and work-study.



DECEMBER 15:

Applicants who file their financial aid application by the Suggested Filing Date of Dec. 15, and are admitted, will receive a preliminary financial aid package as soon as it is available.

preferred admission

Preferred Admission is a way for a student to indicate an interest in later transferring to an upper-level program. Acceptance guarantees placement in the upper-level academic unit if the student meets certain prerequisites during their first year at U-M. The prerequisites vary depending on which upper-level unit is chosen.

Preferred Admission (PA) within U-M is a two-step process:

1. A student must be admitted to a first-year school or college.
2. The student will then be evaluated for PA and — if selected — will later transfer into the upper-level unit.

(If PA is not granted at this stage, the student is still admitted to U-M in their first-year unit.)
