Before filling out the application, please read this information sheet thoroughly for the guidelines for admissibility as a dual enrollment candidate and for information on the documentation that must be included with this application. Electronic submission of application materials is strongly encouraged.

Completed applications should be returned to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions **at least one month in advance of the first day of classes** (see below). Part II must be completed by a secondary school official. Transcripts, including final grades for the last term completed, and other documentation should be sent directly by the institution, but can be turned in to this office by the applicant if contained in an envelope sealed by the issuing institution. Applications submitted after this time period are not guaranteed to be reviewed prior to the beginning of the semester.

This office will determine admissibility as applications are received and will notify the applicant of a decision by email. Students are typically notified of their decision in late August (fall term) or late December (winter term) once space and availability is determined and the application and required

documentation are received.

Applicants who are F-1 or J-1 visa holders must submit a completed Financial Resources Statement (available online at admissions.umich.edu/frs) and supporting documentation. Students already in the U.S. on F-1 or J-1 status must also submit a photocopy of the current I-20 or DS-2019 and I-94 card.

Students who are non-native speakers of English are required to provide proof of English language proficiency by taking the TOEFL (ets.org/toefl), IELTS (ielts.org), or MET (michiganassessment.org/michigan-tests/met-new). Scores should be submitted directly from the testing agency to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Please include a photocopy of your score report or the date on which you plan to take the TOEFL, IELTS, or MET.

Registration

- Dual enrollment students may not register before the first day of classes. University of Michigan students register for classes online. For information about the registration process, see the Office of the Registrar's website at ro.umich.edu. Admitted dual enrollment candidates may ONLY enroll in the specific College of Literature, Science, and the Arts coursework stated in the admissions decision letter, provided spaces are available.
- Students who wish to continue their dual enrollment status should submit a request for continued enrollment that includes the proposed course title and number for the subsequent term of enrollment. The Office of Undergraduate Admissions will notify the student if a new application or additional information is needed. The request should be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at

least one month in advance of the first day of classes (see below). Continuation for subsequent terms is contingent upon successful performance in courses.

- At a later time, if you change from dual enrollment to degree-seeking status and are admitted and enroll, you must contact the Registrar's Office to have all credits and grades for courses you completed as a dual enrollment student added to your U-M academic record.

Eligibility

Before completing the enclosed Dual Enrollment Application, carefully read the information provided below to determine if you are eligible for dual enrollment admission.

To be admitted as a dual enrollment student, you must meet all of the following criteria:

You are a high school student and have:

1. Completed a track of typical college prep courses through the Advanced Placement level.
2. Scored a 4 or 5 on the AP exam to place you in an intermediate level course such as Calculus III or an intermediate level foreign language in the area you are interested in pursuing dual enrollment.

Required Documentation for Dual Enrollment Application:

- Official copy of your high school transcript through completion of your current term of enrollment.
- SAT/ACT scores sent directly by the testing agency to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Note: Exceptions can be made to the SAT/ACT requirement. However, AP results and exhaustion of curriculum will be needed for consideration.
- Copies of AP scores for each subject of interest.
- Completed Part I of the Dual Enrollment Application, including applicant and parent signatures.
- Completed Part II of the Dual Enrollment Application by a high school official certifying that you are eligible.

We highly recommend submission of your application and all available documents before your high school is dismissed for the summer. High school students may not enroll as dual enrollment students for college courses simply because the courses are not offered in their high school (e.g., any first or second year language courses).

The deadline dates for submitting an application apply to the term for which residency is sought and are as follows: Sept. 30 for fall term, Jan. 31 for winter term. Processing times can be lengthy. It is recommended that applications be submitted as soon as possible.
